UCLG ASPAC OVERVIEW

The history of United Cities and Local Governments Asia Pacific (UCLG ASPAC) goes back to the emergence of the International Union of Local Authorities (IULA). IULA was established in 1913 in Belgium with its headquarters in The Hague, Netherlands, while IULA ASPAC was set up in September 1989 during the 29th IULA World Congress in Perth, Western Australia, with Jakarta as its headquarter.

UCLG ASPAC is one of the Regional Sections of United Cities and Local Governments (UCLG), an amalgamation of International Union of Local Authorities, United Towns Organization (UTO), and World Association of the Major Metropolises (METROPOLIS), which began on 1 January 2004 with its headquarters in Barcelona, Spain.

UCLG ASPAC is the new entity of IULA ASPAC, established in Taipei on 14 April 2004 during the 28th IULA ASPAC Executive Committee and Extraordinary Council meetings, following the unification of IULA and UTO at world level. UCLG ASPAC is the key knowledge management hub on local government issues in the region.

UCLG is a worldwide association and the only local government organization recognized by the United Nations, and nominates 10 out of 20 members of the United Nations Advisory Committee of Local Authorities (UNACLA), the first formal advisory body of local authorities affiliated with the UN.

The Asia and Pacific region is the biggest of the Regional Sections in UCLG with linkages to more than 7,000 local governments. It represents well over 3.76 billion people – more than half of the world population – and incorporates economically fast developing countries such as China, India and Indonesia.

VISION

UCLG ASPAC is the united voice and advocate of democratic local self-government, which promotes cooperation between governments and within the wider international communities in the Asia-Pacific Region.

MISSION

- To promote strong and effective democratic local self-government throughout the region/world through fostering unity and cooperation among members;
- To ensure the effective political representation of local government to the UN and other international communities;
- To be the worldwide source of key information on local government, learning, exchange, and capacity building to support democratic local governments and their associations;
- To promote economic, social, cultural, vocational and environmental development in enhancing the services to the citizens based on good governance principles;
- To promote race and gender equality, combating discrimination, promoting decentralized cooperation and international cooperation between local governments and their associations in strong democratic organization;
- To promote twinning and partnership between local governments and peoples.

UCLG ASPAC ORGANIZATION

Based on the constitution of the organization, UCLG ASPAC consists of five principal organs as follow:

1. The Regional Council Assembly

The Regional General Assembly is the supreme organ of the Section. It has responsibility for the overall policy, direction and oversight of the Section. The Regional General Assembly comprises all members of UCLG in the region, through their duly appointed representatives.

2. The Regional Council

The Regional Council is the principal policy-making body of the Section. It decides the Section's policies in a collegial way and ensures that general policies decided by the Regional General Assembly are implemented.

3. The Executive Bureau

The Executive Bureau is responsible for initiating proposals and carrying out the decisions of the Regional Council and for any other matter delegated to it by the Regional Council. It is in charge of the Section's administrative and financial management. It prepares the meetings of the Regional Council and of the Regional General Assembly.

4. The Presidency


The Presidency, comprising the President and six Co-Presidents, is elected by the Regional Council from among local government members representing the different sub-regions, for a renewable term between two ordinary sessions of the Regional General Assembly. The Presidency represents the four sub-regions as well as associate and international members and includes the Co-President (from the host city of the Secretariat) and the Founding President.

Note: To ensure the women representation in the Presidency, the Chair of the Women in Local Governments Standing Committee becomes the Co-President.

5. The Secretary General

The Secretary General is the chief executive officer of the Section. He/she directs the daily activities of the Section and carries out the decisions of the Regional General Assembly, the Regional Council and the Executive Bureau. The Secretary General manages the General Secretariat and the activities, programmes and finances of the Section under the guidance of the Presidency and reporting to the Executive Bureau.

UCLG ASPAC SECRETARIAT

The UCLG ASPAC Secretariat in Jakarta consists of five divisions:

1. Member Services

Responsible in assisting the Secretary General for dealing with statutory issues and preparing the statutory meetings such as the Executive Bureau, Council and General Assembly meetings. The division also prepares business papers for meetings, reports to the President, and supports members on membership policy and membership fee issues.

2. Capacity Development

Responsible for organizing various events related to skills development and knowledge sharing as well as responsible for cooperation programmes with international/regional organizations and networks and implementing the international/regional programmes of UCLG ASPAC and UCLG ASPAC partners such as training, forums, congress, workshops, and regional courses on local government issues.

3. Finance and Administration

Provide regular financial reports and manage membership subscriptions as well as other matters. The division is also supporting the Secretariat with the administration of personnel.

4. Communications and Information


Provide members and related stakeholders with informations related to local government issues, events, best practices and members' activities. Further responsibilities are to provide information materials such as newsletters, organization profile, brochures, annual report as well as to develop and maintain the website.

5. Strategic Services

The main task is to provide support to on-going operations ensuring high quality, accuracy and consistency of the organization's work. The division is also responsible for maintaining relationships with external organizations such as UN agencies, the European Union and the ASEAN Secretariat.




UCLG ASPAC SECRETARIAT CHART

STATUTORY MEETINGS

The Regional Statutory Meetings consist of the General Assembly, Council and Executive Bureau Sessions. The regular Statutory Meetings assure transparency and planning by consensus among members in running the organization. These meetings have been held in conjunction with other strategic events which aim to facilitate the exchange of knowledge between members.



The Regional General Assembly shall be convened every two years normally at the time of the Regional Congress to which both the Section members and non-members are invited.

The Regional Council shall meet at least once a year, as convened by the President or at the request of at least one third of its members.

The Executive Bureau shall meet at least twice a year, as convened by the President or at the request of at least one third of its members.



PROGRAMMES AND PROJECTS

SUPPORT TO DECENTRALIZATION IN DEVELOPING COUNTRIES (SDDC)



The European Commission (EC) funded the project of SDDC in cooperation with UCLG ASPAC designated to support the decentralization and local democracy process in developing countries in order to strengthen local development and good governance.

A Regional Study on Decentralization in Southeast Asia has been completed in 2012. This study was undertaken in seven countries in Southeast Asia, namely Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, the Philippines, Thailand and Vietnam and it resulted in suggestions for decentralization issues including capacity development of Local Authorities (LAs) and Local Government Associations (LGAs).

The collaboration with UCLG ASPAC mainly focuses on supporting the implementation of a survey on local authorities and the realization of regional workshops on decentralization and basic services.

PROGRAMMES AND PROJECTS

PARTNERSHIP FOR DEMOCRATIC LOCAL GOVERNANCE IN SOUTHEAST ASIA (DELGOSEA)



UCLG ASPAC has been promoting and applying good governance principles in cities and local governments from ASEAN members under the framework of DELGOSEA. It has worked in 24 cities and local governments, by identifying good practices and transferring them elsewhere.

The first phase of the DELGOSEA from 2010 to 2012 was funded by the European Commission and co-funded by Konrad-Adenauer-Stiftung (KAS) of Germany with funds originated from the Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ). The project has facilitated the establishment of a network of Local Government Associations, local authorities, non-governmental organizations and academic institutions in the Philippines, Indonesia, Vietnam, Thailand and Cambodia.

Starting from November 2012 onwards, DELGOSEA, co-financed by KAS Manila, continues its 2nd phase with the objective to further exchange knowledge at the local level among countries in Southeast Asia and to advocate and lobby with national governments for empowering cities and local governments.

In 2013, the framework has conducted several activities, including workshops for DELGOSEA Network, internal meetings of the Standing Committee and identification as well as dissemination of new good practices.

PROGRAMMES AND PROJECTS

THE EUROPEAN VOICE OF LOCAL AND REGIONAL AUTHORITIES FOR DEVELOPMENT (PLATFORMA)



PLATFORMA has been the voice of local and regional authorities for development in relation to the EU since its creation in 2008. Its activities are supported in the framework of the 'Non-State Actors and Local Authorities in Development' (NSA/LA) thematic programme, launched in 2007.

PLATFORMA obtained the support of the European Commission from 2012 to 2015 for the project "Dialogue and Capacity Building of Local and Regional Authorities (LRAs) in EU Partner Countries in the Development and Local Governance Fields". For these three years, UCLG ASPAC and its members are implementing this project in the Asia-Pacific region. One of the activities is to conduct a survey on members for an assessment of the state of play of Local Government Associations in the Asia Pacific region.

DISASTER RISK REDUCTION

UCLG ASPAC plays actively in engaging local governments to implement Disaster Risk Reduction (DDR). UCLG ASPAC will continue cooperating with UNISDR to put the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction 2015-2030 into action at the local level.

PROGRAMMES AND PROJECTS ENHANCE WOMEN IN LOCAL GOVERNMENTS



The need for the enhancement of women in Local Government is critical. UCLG ASPAC's Standing Committee on Women in Local Government focuses its activities on strengthening women's local public leadership and mainstreaming good practices for developing gender-responsive programmes and strategies.

“Zero Waste is Possible in Our Place” is a new programme of UCLG ASPAC that aims to raise awareness on solid waste reduction and 3Rs through environmental education, research, training and capacity development.

UCLG ASPAC assists its members to implement recycling and explore the possibilities of the recycling industry by building their capacity to minimize waste as well as changing our society’s mentality that “Trash Is Cash”.

LOW CARBON SOCIETY PROJECT

The Low Carbon Society Project has been initiated in 2014 by the Wakatobi Regency Government and UCLG ASPAC, in an effort to develop an ecological developing model for small island territories.

Low Carbon Society is a joint effort of all stakeholders, including local government, the community and academe to reduce carbon emissions using various approaches.

PROGRAMMES & PROJECTS

LOCAL OFFICIALS PROFESSIONAL EXCHANGE AND INTERNSHIP PROGRAM



UCLG ASPAC established the Local Officials Professional Exchange and Internship Programmes in 2013. The programmes feature on-the-job capacity development at the Secretariat for city officials and university students with professional involvement in different projects and programmes.
