A. INTRODUCTION

United Cities and Local Governments Asia Pacific (UCLG ASPAC) is the biggest regional section of the United Cities and Local Governments (UCLG), whose Secretariat is based in Jakarta, Indonesia, and is hosted by the Provincial Government of Jakarta. UCLG is a worldwide association of local governments and the officially recognised voice of local governments by the United Nations. UCLG ASPAC has linkages to more than 7,000 local governments. It represents well over 3.76 billion people—more than half of the world population—and incorporates economically fast-developing countries such as China, India, and Indonesia.

UCLG ASPAC is the key knowledge management hub on local government issues in the Asia-Pacific region. It promotes democratic local government, supports cooperation between cities, local governments, and their associations, and facilitates programmes, networks, and partnerships to develop the capacity of local governments and the associations. Moreover, UCLG ASPAC represents local governments politically within the international community and with the United Nations and its agencies. It also promotes inclusive societies, which safeguard equality, social and economic justice, and sustainable community development.

CRIC is a five (5) years project with the overall objective of promoting long-lasting and unique cooperation through triangular cooperation between cities and research centres in Europe, South Asia (India, Nepal, Bangladesh), and Southeast Asia (Indonesia, Malaysia, Philippines, Thailand). CRIC is currently being implemented in 10 pilot cities in Indonesia: Bandar Lampung, Banjarmasin, Cirebon, Gorontalo, Kupang, Mataram, Pangkalpinang, Pekanbaru, Samarinda, and Ternate.

CRIC is working with UCLG ASPAC, the European Union, and its partners: Pilot4Dev, ECOLISE, ACR+, UGE, and AIILSG to enhance the capacity of targeted city governments to plan for the impacts of climate change, and to promote triangular cooperation between cities and research centers in Europe, South Asia, and Southeast Asia.

CRIC main activities include training and technical support to prepare climate action plans, as well as developing thematic tools and training materials to solve cities' climate-related challenges.

The thematic tools and training materials describe about the development of early warning system and urban resilience (in Bandar Lampung, Pangkalpinang, and Ternate), waste management (in







Mataram, Cirebon, Pekanbaru, and Banjarmasin), water scarcity management (in Kupang), bioregional governance (in all cities), and sanitation (in Gorontalo).

CRIC is facilitating a thematic panel of experts and conducting training to discuss challenges, and opportunities, share solutions, and foster cooperation and collaboration amongst CRIC stakeholders.

The first thematic panel of experts and training will discuss the "Early Warning System and Urban Resilience" with the main theme "Building City Resilience through Triangular Cooperation." The panel of experts serves as a platform for dialogue, partnership-building, and exchanging ideas and best practices on climate resilience and inclusiveness. It is expected to support pilot cities in implementing Climate Action Plans (CAPs) and to open up opportunities for triangular cooperation.

B. OBJECTIVES

The panel aims to:

- Facilitate dialogue for the implementation of thematic tools and training materials (Early Warning System and Urban Resilience) developed by CRIC partners (UGE and Pilot4Dev) for 3 CRIC pilot cities (Bandar Lampung, Pangkalpinang and Ternate) to be replicated in other cities.
- Discuss current and future challenges and opportunities in climate change adaptation and mitigation to encourage collaboration and inclusive participation.
- Discuss challenges and opportunities for implementation of tools and training materials in the city's climate action plan.
- Discuss best practices and lessons learned by cities in Europe, South and Southeast Asia relevant to climate change mitigation and adaptation.

To support the objective of the event, UCLG ASPAC Secretariat will need to procure a **Hotel Accommodation and Meeting Package** for 4 – 8 March 2024.
